

INFANT LIFE & INFANT DEATH (CONT'D)

Two short live-animation films will be presented for comment & discussion.



'Laid Down', is set over the first few months of life. Dipping in and out of animated dream sequences, we encounter the turbulent relationship between the baby's parents from the raw, emotional, and preverbal perspective of the newborn infant.

'Flown', paints a surreal portrait of two individuals struggling to cope with their feelings of loss of their infant. This film attempts to unearth the unconscious feelings of these parents, whose relationship fails following the death of their infant.



These two short films are presented and discussed from the filmmaker's and a psychoanalyst's perspectives.

The participants will be offered an emotionally charged and engaging journey as seen through the eyes of both the infant and parents.
